
scott woodard, athletic director

They say an army is just as good as its leader. If that's the case, the WNMU coaching staff is in good hands. Scott Woodard enters his 10th year as Athletic Director for WNMU with high hopes. Woodard, a 1985 graduate of WNMU was an all-star shortstop at Western, and was twice named to the all conference team in the tough Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The Carlsbad, New Mexico product received his Bachelor of Science in Biology and his Master of Arts Administration.

While Woodard was a star on the baseball field as a player, his true talent may be in the dugout, as his now-eight-year-old softball team has become the tyrants of the Pacific West Conference, rolling up the last three Pac-West Championship banners. Woodard stepped aside after the 2001 season from coaching to be able to spend more time getting the athletic department back in the role of dominance it held in the early 1990s.


"We have some extremely successful programs here, and we are striving to make all the sports very competitive," says Woodard. "We all (coaches) recruit the same areas, and I can honestly say for the first time since I've been here, we have a staff that is aggressive and will bring in top quality kids and those kids will leave Silver City with a quality degree and a great athletic experience."



Victoria Stimac has headed south to take the reins of the newly created Assistant Athletic Director of Media Relations in the spring of 2007. Stimac handles the duties of sports information director as well as senior woman administrator and will coordinate community and university relations for the athletic department.

Formerly at Finlandia University in Michigan, Stimac was the assistant athletic director, senior woman administrator, sports information director, and head women's volleyball coach for four years.

Originally from Cedar Grove, Wisconsin, she played volleyball at Cardinal Stritch University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where she was a three-year volleyball starter as a middle hitter and co-captain her final season and majored in business and marketing.



Dr. Roland Shook held the Faculty Athletic Representative post since 1993 and was an integral part of the Athletic Department, as well as the university's academic department. Now in his retirement, Dr. Shook has the responsibility of the being the Mustang's compliance coordinator. His responsibilities as the compliance coordinator include scrutinizing each athlete's transcript and signing off on their eligibility status and acting as arbitrator and investigator when student athlete, coaching or other athletics related issues arise.

She coordinates the teams' fundraising and travel accounts, while managing the student work studies. chris jeppson, men's athletic trainer

Chris Jeppson joined the Western New Mexico University athletic training staff in 2006 after receiving a Master of Science degree in Athletic Training from Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Indiana. While in Terre Haute, Jeppson worked at Terre Haute North High School as an athletic trainer.

He received his undergraduate degrees in 2001 and 2005 from Weber State University (Associate of Art in Foreign Language) and the University of Utah (Bachelor of Science in Exercise and Sport Science) respectively. While at the University of Utah, he was able to work with the University's football camp in 2004.

Jeppson has certifications in EMT-Basic, CPR, AED and first-aid instruction for the American Red Cross in the professional and community certification levels. He currently is an instructor of first-aid/CPR and athletic training courses at WNMU.

Terra Strain returns to Silver City and WNMU after seven years away. In her first year as a staff member, she will assist the successful volleyball program and be full-time in the athletic training room where she will work with the Western New Mexico women's programs.

Strain, a graduate of the Movement Science program at Western, wore a Mustang volleyball jersey from 1996-2000. During her four years, she was on the Gold Honor board each semester. She also was named to the Pac-West All-Conference Academic Team in 1999.

After WNMU, Strain attended Montana State University - Billings where she received her Master of Science in Athletic Training degree in 2006. She also was an assistant volleyball coach for the Yellowjackets for one year.

Most recently, Strain worked as an athletic trainer and head girl's volleyball coach at Bradshaw Mountain High School. The Virden, New Mexico native also coached for the Arizona Mile High Volleyball Club for one year and three years at Holbrook High School in Arizona. At Holbrook, she was the 3A North Co-Coach of the Year in 2002 and the 2004 1A-3A All-Star Coach in 2004.

claudia leonard, faculty athletic representative

Originally from Detroit, Michigan, Claudia Leonard joins the Mustang staff this year as the faculty athletic representative. An associate professor in the Occupation Therapy Assistant (OTA) program, Leonard first came to WNMU in 1997 and then took a break for two and a half years from WNMU before returning again in the fall of 2005. She currently serves as the academic fieldwork coordinator in the OTA department.

Leonard received her Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy from Eastern Michigan University in 1983. She then went on to earn her master's degree in business from WNMU in 2001. She recently com-

pleted her Doctorate in Occupational Therapy at the University of St. Augustine.

Leonard is an active board member for the Casa de Cultura en Santa Clara in her spare time along with participating in sprint triathlons.

bernie busken, head coach

Busken has taken over the reins as the Head Football Coach for the 2007 season after a three year stint of coaching on both sides of the ball, as well as the special teams for WNMU.

Coach Busken has achieved legendary status in the prep ranks in Arizona, where he was named "Coach of the Decade" in the 1990s. The (Mesa) Mountain View Toros won three 5A State Champion-ships under his tutelage and earned an impressive 82-9 record. During his 82 wins, Busken tallied 40 straight wins, setting the Arizona 5A state record. Three former Busken students are currently in the NFL --Ronnie Heard (coaching with the Minnesota Vikings), John Beck (Miami Dolphins) and Todd Heap (Baltimore Ravens).



At WNMU, Busken has coached the linebackers, offensive line and special teams. His defensive charges include some of WNMU's very best -- 2005 saw Valentine Chude dominate from his linebacker spot, while this year's man in the middle, Christian Serena (a Busken recruit), was the RMAC Defensive Player of the Year.

Coach Busken's place-kickers have also been a bright spot for the Mustangs. In 2005, Kevin Hughes finished #16 in Division II in field goals. In 2006, Sean Sehnem was both an RMAC and National Special Teams Player of the Week courtesy of his 43.7 punting average and being #1 in the nation in field goals made per game.

In addition to his tenure at Mountain View, Coach Busken has coached at Duncan High School (Oklahoma), Fort Worth Country Day High School (Texas), Brazoswood High School (Texas); Farmington High School (New Mexico), as well as Millsaps College, Southeastern Oklahoma State, West Texas A&M and Southern Utah University.

As a player, the 1975 Missouri Southern State University grad started 42 straight college games and was a member of MSU's 1972 National Championship team. Busken was named as the MSU Lions' outstanding receiver in 1972 and 1973 and the team's most valuable player in 1973. He was named to MSSU Hall of Fame in 1992.

Coach Busken received his Bachelor of Science in Physical Education and his Master of Science in Secondary Educational Administration, while maintaining his outstanding athletic and coaching career.

He currently resides in Silver City with his wife, Kristi. The couple has two daughters, Brooke and Willy.

don kramer, defensive coordinator

Don Kramer enters his first year as a Mustang coach. Kramer has been a high school coach for 32 years. Nine of those seasons were served as a defensive coordinator at Mountain View High school in Mesa, Arizona.

While at Mountain View High School, Kramer was selected as Arizona's outstanding assistant coach three separate times. Coach Kramer is known for being a great on-field teacher whose intensity is backed up by his impressive numbers. In his nine seasons at Mountain View, his defenses gave up an average under six points per game. In 2002, his defense gave up a minimal 27 points in 14 games.



Kramer also has coached in the Arizona 4A-5A All-Star Game and has made the trip to the state championship game 11 times and winning seven. Kramer was a big part of those wins.

Coach Kramer attended Seton Catholic High School in Arizona where he was the MVP of the team. Later he attended Northern Arizona University for his undergraduate and graduate degrees.

chuck kelly, defensive line/special teams coach

Coach Kelly has been a staple at WNMU for the last 30 years as the Director of Financial Aid and as an assistant football coach. At Western New Mexico University, Kelly has worked with the linebackers and defensive line during his tenure. This season he will work specifically with the defensive line and special teams.

Kelly started his coaching career at the famous Mt. Carmel High School in the tough Chicago Catholic League. He was selected the Coach-of-the-Year.

After a short stint at Wausau High School (WI) as a football coach and head wrestling coach, he joined the college ranks. Kelly worked with the linebackers at New Mexico State University and then went on to become the offensive coordinator for the Aggies under Coach Jim Bradley.

Kelly grew up in Chicago, Illinois and attended high school at the first place he coached, Mt. Carmel High School. He started on the "City Champion" football team and was selected as an all-city linebacker.

After high school, he headed west to attend the University of New Mexico where he was a three-year starting linebacker on the three-time WAC Champion Lobo football team. He can proudly say he was a significant part of one of the best teams in the history of UNM football. Kelly was a Second-Team All-WAC selection during his term there.

russell kuhns, offensive line/strength and conditioning coach

Russell Kuhns, a native of Bellevue, Ohio, begins his first year as a member of the Mustang coach staff. Kuhns comes to Silver City after three seasons as a graduate assistant working with the offensive line at Bowling Green State University.

As a student athlete in the linebacker and fullback position on the University of Wisconsin football team, he earned three letters from 2000-2002. Kuhns played on the Badgers' 2002 Alamo Bowl and 2001 Sun Bowl and 2000 Rose Bowl championship squads.

As a senior, he caught five passes for 53 yards and had two tackles, including a forced fumble on special teams for the Badgers. He appeared in 11 games in 2001 and was named Academic All-Big Ten. In 2000, he was a standout on special teams recording nine tackles. In 1999, he was named Scout Team Player of the Year during his redshirt season. He began his collegiate career at Findlay in 1998 before transferring to Wisconsin.

A 1998 graduate of Bellevue High School, he was a three-time all-state honoree in football and wrestling for the Redmen. He also was team MVP in wrestling, football and track his senior year. He earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from Wisconsin in 2003 and a master's in exercise physiology at Bowling Green University in 2007.

kelron sykes, linebackers coach

Making the move from Arizona, Kelron Sykes makes WNMU his new home this season. Sykes comes to WNMU after one year at Scottsdale Community College, working specifically with linebackers. Prior, he coached with the Columbus Destroyers after an injury sidelined him in 2005.

Sykes had a very successful playing career before joining the coaching ranks. He attended Oregon State University (OSU) where he received his Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies and played for the Beavers for four years (1994-1999). Two of those years he was the starting linebacker. He received defensive player of the week eight separate times at OSU.



After college, Sykes attended the San Diego Chargers (NFL, 1999) camp. He then spent one year with the Las Angeles Extreme (XFL, 2000) and finished his playing career in the Arena Football League (AFL), playing for the Los Angeles Avengers (2001),

Georgia Force (2002), Carolina Cobras (2003), and the Columbus Destroyers (2004-2005).

marques reischl, wide receivers coach/academic coordinator

Entering his third year, Marques Reischl will work primarily with wide receivers and be the team's academic coordinator. Prior to the 2007 season, he dedicated his time to the quarterbacks.

Reischl, himself, spent 2001 to 2004 as the Mustangs' quarterback, playing in 29 games during his career. He combined for a total of 20 touchdowns and 2573 yards over the four years.

Upon completion of his senior season at WNMU, he competed for the San Angelo Stampede of the National Indoor Football League. He also had a short stint with the Johnstown Riverhawks of the American Indoor Football League before an injury cut his season short.



The Tombstone, Arizona native attended Tombstone High School where he was a multiple sport athlete (football, basketball, tennis).

Reischl received his Bachelor of Arts in Science Education in 2005 and is currently working on his master's in education leadership from WNMU.

As a student at WNMU, Salas was a member of the Mustangs football team from 1992-1996 and the recipient of the Jeff Weiler Memorial Scholarship. Entering his first year as an assistant coach at the collegiate level, Brent Hines will work with the Mustang secondary, while attending WNMU as a business management major.




athletic hall of fame inductees



Mr. Harold Howard is a 1964 graduate from Rochester, Indiana. This multi-sport athlete participated in basketball, track, and golf.

As a four-year letterwinner in basketball, Howard was voted the team's most valuable player in 1961 and 1962. This led to two honors as an All-Conference selection and one Little All-American District 7 selection. In 1962, Howard tied the fieldhouse record of most points in one game with 43 points. He shared this honor with Brook Jenning. Also in 1962, he also was a member of the first-place winning relay track team.

An active member of the Western New Mexico University Alumni Association Indiana Chapter, Howard is married to his wife, Nancy. Together they had two children, Cheryl and Kevin.



A member of the WNMU athletic programs in the 1960s, Walter Winkowski graduated from WNMU in 1965 with a bachelor's degree and in 1966 with a master's degree in business education.

Winkowski participated four years in a Mustang football jersey and four years in a Mustang baseball uniform. In 1962, he was selected to the All-Frontier Conference Honorable Mention team for his efforts on the football field. He tied for the longest touchdown pass in the nation that year – 95 yards. He also gained over 100 yards in the first half as a running back against Adams State during his senior year.

As a second baseman, catcher, and left fielder in baseball, Winkowski batted .300 all four years he played, hitting .444 his junior year, ranking him 17th in the country that year.

In 1963, Winkowski was honored with the All-Sports Award.

He now resides in Glenshaw, Pennsylvania, with his wife LaVerne and two children, Brittany and Ryan.

season preview

Despite having a good showing in the Mustangs' inaugural season as a member of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (3-5 RMAC, 5-5 overall), the team hopes to move past the .500 mark in the 2007 season. The Mustangs have not been able to break .500 since the 1993 season when they went 7-3.

Regardless, the 2007 Western New Mexico University football team will look to the future rather than looking in the past. With a new head coach, many new assistant coaches, a new offense, a new defense, new faces, and new roles for returners, the 2007 season is the time to build the strong foundation for successful years to come.

First-year head coach Bernie Busken has a good groundwork to make that move above .500. With six starters on offense returning (12 total) and seven starters on defense (13 total), Busken looks to be competitive because of their experience. "We want to put a competitive physical football team on the field that competes on both sides of the ball every play," says Busken. "Many of these individuals have great experience and are consistent players who you can depend on to give their very best."

As the Mustangs new coach, there will undoubtedly be challenges. One challenge will be the 32 upperclassmen newcomers, five signed freshmen, and 30-plus walk-ons. That is a total of 67+ new purple and gold athletes. "How quickly we come together as a team will determine our early success," comments Busken. "We must find our identity quickly because all the teams we play are very well coached." This is where the experience of the 12 offensive and 13 defensive returners will play a huge role. "We are excited in the direction the program is moving especially the character and leadership our older players show."

offense

The 2007 offense is a relatively new unit as there are only 12 returners to the offense; however, those returners are strong and the talented transfers and underclassmen who have come in will help build a foundation.

The blocks of the foundation include junior lineman **Ed Johnson** (Austin, TX) and senior offensive linemen **Jon Such** (Torrance, CA) and **Miguel Sandoval** (Tucson, AZ). "These three players give us a foundation to build on," states Busken. "They have excellent blocking up front. We are excited to see what they will do this year." Last season, the offensive line, including Johnson, Such, and Sandoval, helped bring success to wide receiver **Rod Windsor** (Bessemer, AL) by tallying ten touchdowns and an overall team total of 12 rushing touchdowns.

Other returners making an impact on the scoreboard are **Andrew Rodriguez** (El Paso, TX), **Chris Cook** (Tucson, AZ), and **Mike Torres** (Albuquerque, NM). Rodriguez compliments Windsor in the wide receiver position. Only a sophomore this season, Rodriguez averaged 7.9 yards per game last season as a freshman.

Cook, a senior, fills a tight end slot. At 6'4" and 245 pounds, he played in eight of the ten games last season. "Chris can run and block very well," comments Busken.

Torres, a fullback, will play his last season in a purple jersey. "Mike has been outstanding as a player and as a citizen. He has put in a lot of hard work," says Busken.

Fifteen strong newcomers consisting of four offensive linemen, three running backs, two wide receivers, two quarterbacks, two tight ends, and two full backs have caught the eyes of the Mustang coaching staff in the recruiting process. "All of these young men will come in and compete to start on offense and will allow us to have depth and fire power," remarks Busken. "There should be great competition at each position, which should improve our offense greatly."

One of these strong newcomers is **Tramell McGill** (Phoenix, AZ) who played one year at Colorado State University (2005) and red-shirted the year before. As a running back, he helped lead his team in high school to the state championship in 2003 and was named the MVP of the game. He also was named Fiesta Region Player of the Year, First Team All-State, Red Zone Player of the Year, and First Team All-East Valley as a prep.

Stanley Nihipali (Alea, HI), a transfer from Fresno City College, occupies a roster slot in the quarterback position. As a sophomore and junior in high school, he helped lead his team to two state championship games. Nihipali was a First Team All-State member and was the Most Valuable Player (MVP) of the Hawaii All-Star Game his senior year of high school.

A transfer from Southern Utah University, **Tremaine Cox** (Tucson, AZ) moves closer to home to join the Mustangs. While at Tucson High School, Cox was number two in rushing yards in the city. He was also named the MVP of the Week by KOLD News.

season preview

defense

Busken plans to have great depth on defense this year, especially with the secondary and linebackers. **Christian Serena** (Scottsdale, AZ) returns for his senior year after a very successful 2006 season. Serena was named RMAC Defensive Player of the Year and placed on Don Hansen's All-Southwest Region Second Team and Daktronics All-Southwest Region Second Team. He totaled 60 solo tackles, 43 assist tackles, and four sacks in the team's ten games.

Also on defense is cornerback Latron Hickson (Miami, FL). The All-RMAC Second Team member. He also posted big numbers with 22 solo tackles, 14 assist tackles, one sack. Seniors Casey Bell (Escondido, CA) and Cisco Valenzuela (Tucson, AZ) will strengthen the defense also. They both make the move to defensive end after playing on the offensive line last season

"I think you will see a much more athletic group out there. They will be extremely quick and physical," says Busken. "Their hard work and preparation for this season has been amazing." **Jon Garza** (Las Cruces, NM) and **Tony Norman** (Richmond, CA) are two individuals that put their time in in the off season. "Their character and discipline will be a big factor this fall," continues Busken. Garza and Norman are both defensive backs.

Nine solid transfers are competing for a starting spot on defense. A defensive lineman putting on the Mustang jersey for the first time in his career is **Eric Camarillo** (Signal Hill, CA), a transfer student from Cerritos College and Fayetteville State University. In high school, Camarillo was All-League, All-City, All-California Interscholastic Federation (CIF), First Team *Press Telegram* Dream Team, and the Mayfair High School Most Valuable Player (MVP).

Joining Camarillo is **Jeremy Ehinger** (Torrance, CA). At 6'3" and 265 pounds, Ehinger comes to WNMU after spending one year at two-time defending NCAA Division II Champions Grand Valley State University and two years at Los Angeles Harbor College (LAHC). While at LAHJC, he earned All-Western Lakes Conference honors as a sophomore and tallied 49 tackles and two quarterback sacks as a freshman. He currently is the record holder at LAHJC for most tackles in one game (15).

Chaz Scott (Chandler, AZ) rounds out the group. The transfer from Oregon State University was the PAC 10 Special Teams Player of the Year in 2003.

"All of these young men are outstanding football players, excellent students, and really like to run and hit," comments Busken. "They are all really physical. Each will make a great contribution and will help us to be very physical."

special teams

The Mustangs are relying on two kickers/punters new to Silver City: **Steve Flores** (Peoria, AZ) and **Mike Whitcher** (Redondo Beach, CA). A multi-sport athlete in high school, Flores, 5'11", 180 pounds, was a four-year varsity soccer player as well as a football player. He was an all-region soccer player as a junior and senior. In football, he was Second Team All-Region his senior year as a kicker. He then joined the Glendale Community College program. While there, he was a Second Team All-WSFL choice in 2005 and 2006. He also was an NJCAA Second Team All-American in 2006. "As a kicker, he has a very powerful leg with great range. Steve will be a great offensive threat for the Mustangs," remarks Busken.

Whitcher, a transfer from Los Angeles Harbor College, fills the punters position. "Mike is an outstanding punter," says Busken. "We hope he will continue the excellent kicking game WNMU had." Last season, former Mustang **Sean Sehnam** was named dllfootball.com's National Special Teams Player of the Week and was placed on Don Hansen's All-Southwest Region Third Team. Senham averaged 43.2 yards each punt and 59.6 yards each kickoff. He finished the season going 15-20 on field goals.

final thoughts

The Mustangs have a tough schedule this season, opening at Division IAA power Northern Arizona University. "It is a very challenging schedule," says Busken, "that you must be ready to play every week. The coaching in the RMAC is excellent. We have to be and WILL BE in great shape both physically and mentally each week. We have great depth and should be very competitive this season."

And that is the game plan. Move forward. Look ahead. Build strong foundations.....foundations that will take the Mustangs over the .500 mark.....and never look back.




