They say an army is just as good as its leader. If that's the case, the WNMU coaching staff is in good hands. Scott Woodard enters his 10th year as Athletic Director for WNMU with high hopes. Woodard, a 1985 graduate of WNMU was an all-star shortstop at Western, and was twice named to the all conference team in the tough Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The Carlsbad, New Mexico product received his Bachelor of Science in Biology and his Master of Arts Administration.

While Woodard was a star on the baseball field as a player, his true talent may be in the dugout, as his now-eight-year-old softball team has become the tyrants of the Pacific West Conference, rolling up the last three Pac-West Championship banners. Woodard stepped aside after the 2001 season from coaching to be able to spend more time getting the athletic department back in the role of dominance it held in the early 1990s.

"We have some extremely successful programs here, and we are striving to make all the sports very competitive," says Woodard. "We all (coaches) recruit the same areas, and I can honestly say for the first time since I've been here, we have a staff that is aggressive and will bring in top quality kids and those kids will leave Silver City with a quality degree and a great athletic experience."

Victoria Stimac has headed south to take the reins of the newly created Assistant Athletic Director of Media Relations in the spring of 2007. Stimac handles the duties of sports information director as well as senior woman administrator and will coordinate community and university relations for the athletic department.

Formerly at Finlandia University in Michigan, Stimac was the assistant athletic director, senior woman administrator, sports information director, and head women's volleyball coach for four years.

dr. roland shook, compliance coordinator

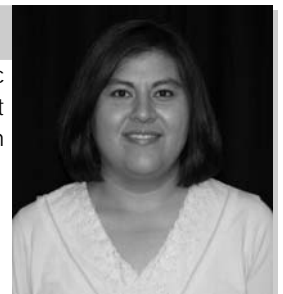

brent hansen, head coach

Brent Hansen enters his third year as the head coach for the Mustangs. Last year the Mustangs debuted in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference by finishing fifth in the RMAC West Division and posted three players to conference honors.

Coach Hansen comes to Western New Mexico University from Fresno State, where he served as an assistant coach with the women's basketball team from 1999-2001.

Coach Hansen has also coached WNMU's highly successful cross country program for two years, where he took the team from startup to Heartland Conference 2005-2006 champions in just two seasons. He was also recognized as Coach of the Year for the same reason.

A native of Ridgecrest, California, Hansen attended graduate school at Fresno State obtaining a master's degree in Kinesiology. During the summer of 2002, he worked basketball camps at Stanford, UCLA, and Utah. He also has experience teaching summer camps at Brigham Young University, St. Mary's University, and Arizona State University.

Married to wife Heather, they have three children: Talyse and twins, Christian and Addison.



laura stratton, assistant coach

Laura Stratton enters her second year as the assistant women's basketball coach at Western New Mexico.

Originally from Missoula, Montana, Stratton was the female high school Player of the Year. She then moved on to Ricks College for one year where she helped her team to a conference championship and an invitation to the NJCAA tournament.

Stratton went on to play at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah for four years, and her team was involved in post season play three of those years. Her final year at BYU, the women's basketball team had their best record in school history at 26-6 while earning a national ranking of 16. They were the Mountain West Conference champions and played into the second round of the NCAA tournament.



crystal smith, student assistant coach

Crystal Smith enters her first year as part of the coaching staff after playing at Western New Mexico University for four years. While playing at WNMU, she was named captain two years. She also made the RMAC All-Academic Second Team and RMAC Honorable Mention Team.

Smith, originally from El Paso, Texas, went to Franklin High School where she named to the All-City First Team her junior and senior year, All-District First Team all four years, and MVP of the Mountain View Tournament.

Smith will graduate in May with a degree in Rehabilitative Services and a minor in Occupational Therapy.

2007-2008 women's basketball review and preview

The WNMU women's basketball team is picked to finish sixth of seven teams in the RMAC West Division according to the 2007-2008 RMAC Preseason Poll. Third-year head coach Brent Hansen is going to try to prove it wrong. "Last season we wanted to start a winning tradition, and we started doing that with a few big wins," says Hansen.

Last season, the Mustangs captured two large victories over Colorado State University – Pueblo and Regis University, two teams that are consistently at the top of the RMAC standings. "It was exciting to know we could play at that caliber," states Hansen. "It shows everyone where they can be if they give their all. It also showed that we can beat anyone in the conference."

Despite smaller numbers and some young faces, Hansen is confident that this group can continue to work on the winning tradition. And that winning tradition begins with four key returners: **Ashley Vigil** (Albuquerque, NM), **Whitney Card** (Tucson, AZ), **Jocelyn Chavez** (Belen, NM), and **Whitney Lewis** (Marana, AZ).

Vigil returns in the Mustang jersey after having an outstanding freshman year. Leading the team with 75 assists, the 5-6 guard earned a spot on the RMAC All-West Honorable Mention team. "Last year Ashley blew onto the scene and made an immediate impact at the point guard spot," comments Hansen. "She has the ability to be one of the top players in the RMAC. She makes us go." Vigil also registered 8.0 points, the third highest on the team.

Card and Chavez plan to help Vigil in the guard position. Each saw time in every game last season, averaging 18-20 minutes per game. Hansen will look to Card to shoot from the outside. "She is one of our best shooters," says Hansen. Last season Card went .354 from behind the arc. She was also the team's third best free throw shooter at .702.

Chavez brings athleticism and intensity to the floor. Posting consistent numbers across the board, she snagged 2.8 rebounds per game and 5.7 points per game. "We are looking for Jocelyn to build on last year's success. A steady defensive contributor, we are looking for her to be more of an offensive threat, as well as providing more leadership on and off the floor."

Lewis adds size to the Mustang line-up. At 5-11, Lewis, a power forward, is the one of the team's best rebounders and defenders. She averaged 4.2 rebounds during the 2006-2007 season, the best on the team, and pitched in with 7.1 points. "Whitney is a true competitor in every sense of the word. We will be looking for Whitney to be a huge contributor this year," says Coach Hansen.

"We are looking to infuse the youth with some our returners to continue with the success we had last season," continues Hansen. Seeing some time on the hardwood this season will be freshman **Jamonica Hudgins** (Las Cruces, NM) and transfer **Kristyn Flanagan** (El Paso, TX). "Jamonica brings a lot of speed, quickness, and energy to the team," says Hansen. "Kristyn brings us athleticism and strength. They both will be solid contributors to the program." And that is exactly what Hansen is looking for to bring success to the women's basketball program during the 2007-2008 campaign.

The Mustangs have a solid non-conference schedule that will prepare the team for a rigorous conference schedule. If they get a few early wins, they may have the momentum to steamroll over the RMAC. "Everybody can beat everybody," says Hansen. "There is not one team in the West Division that I don't think we can't beat."

So despite being picked sixth in the preseason poll, it looks like it could be anyone's season....including the Mustangs.

mark coleman, head coach

Coach Coleman heads into his fifth season at WNMU after perhaps four of his best seasons at the helm of any of his 13 seasons as the man in charge.

After spending eight seasons at Drew University in New Jersey, Coleman was selected to resurrect a Mustang program that had been decimated by losses in the early 2000s. In 1996-97, Coleman earned Coach of the Year honors after leading his Drew University Rangers to a 19-9 record and their first ever ECAC Championship.

Coleman spent eight years as an assistant coach at the University of Pittsburgh where he handled much of the recruiting and scouting for the Panthers. While at Pitt, Coleman helped guide the team to five NCAA appearances as well as two Big East titles. Prior to his tenure at Pitt, Coleman served as an assistant coach at Canisius College, the University of Vermont, and George Mason University where he helped guide the Patriots to its first NIT appearance in school history.

Throughout his 22-years of coaching, Coleman has coached seven NBA players including former New York Knick Charles Smith and the Vancouver Grizzlies' Eric Mobley.

As a player, the 1983 St. Lawrence University grad was a team captain and MVP as a senior. He was also a three-year All-Conference selection and led the Saints to two NCAA Division III Tournament appearances.

Coach Coleman received his Bachelor of Science degree in Sociology.

Coach Coleman is married to the former Dr. Jennifer Halleran in 2004, who accompanied him to Silver City from Drew. Dr. Coleman is a faculty member at WNMU in the Psychology Department.

The Colemans have one child, Kona (1), and are parents to three former residents of the Grant County Humane Society, Nike, Tiger, and Hale.



matt raidbard, assistant coach

Coach Raidbard comes to WNMU from the heart of basketball country — Illinois. The 23-year-old has a passion for coaching as he has coached at both the high school and junior high level in the Chicagoland area. In fact, he has the honor of being the youngest head coach in the State of Illinois as he headed up a team as a 13-year-old. Under his leadership, his teams have played for five league championships at various levels.

At WNMU, Coach Raidbard assists with recruiting, individual workouts, video exchange, and academic issues.

The Indiana University graduate majored in history and classical studies and received his Bachelor of Arts in 2006. He is currently working towards his master's degree in educational leadership at WNMU.

## 2007-2008 men's basketball preview and review

Will the men's basketball team make the RMAC tournament this season? That is the big question and what fifth-year head coach Mark Coleman is hoping for. Going 8-11 in conference during the 2006-2007 season was not quite good enough to make the cut, but with three seniors who were members of Coleman's first recruiting class, things look promising for the 2007-2008 campaign.

**Casey Crevelone** (Tucson, AZ), **Kris Taylor** (Mesa, AZ), and **Trey Clarkson** (Tucson, AZ) return for their fourth and final season in a Mustang jersey. Of the 27 games last season, the now-seniors were high scorers in 14 of the games and high rebounders in 18 games.

"These guys have played a key role on the team since they were freshmen," says Coleman. This will be their senior season, and hopefully they will step up."

Crevelone, a 6-4 forward, was second in scoring last season with 10.8 points per game and led the team in minutes played (33.1), steals (31), and rebounds per game (4.6). When asked what were some key moments last season, Coach Coleman responded with beating Grand Canyon University in Silver City, his first win ever over the Lopes. Crevelone posted strong numbers that night with 11 points and eight rebounds.

A 6-7 forward, Taylor posted two double-doubles last season. The first came in a loss at the University of Hawaii - Hilo (18 points, 10 rebounds). The second was recorded in Silver City in a convincing win against Southwestern College (11 points, 10 rebounds). Overall, Taylor averaged 7.1 points and 4.5 rebounds.

The final senior received conference recognition after the 2006-2007 season: RMAC All-West Second Team honors. Clarkson was the Mustangs number one scorer, averaging 13.3 points per game. He scored 14-plus points in 13 games. In five of those games, he scored 19 or more points.

"This should be a special year for these seniors," states Coleman. "They improved this program. They are leaving it better than it was before they got here."

The seniors are not the only returners Coach Coleman is hoping to have a "special year". The 2006-2007 RMAC West Division Freshman of the Year, **DJ Nicholas** (Glendale, AZ), returns as a sophomore. Nicholas, 6-6, played in all 27 games of the season and started in six. He led the team in field goal percentage (.548) and blocks (28). He also pitched in with 7.9 points and 4.0 rebounds per game.

-up option for Casey, which we didn't have before," says Coleman. "Justin can play in all three guard positions. He can penetrate and create his own shot."

Looking at the schedule, the Mustangs face a tough early season with two Division I opponents. "If we can be successful early, hopefully it will help us in conference," says Coleman. The Mustangs are picked to finish fourth in the conference. Last year's West Division winners, Fort Lewis College, are picked to finish first again this season.

"These returners will be counted on to fill bigger roles," comments Coleman. These roles include filling in the gaps for Jason Jackson and Shannon Doctor who decided not to return this season. Jackson started in 19 games and played in 24 games, and Doctor played in 26 games. Doctor turned his play up a notch at the end of the season, leading the team in scoring in three of the five final games.

Also hoping to fill in the gaps left by Jackson and Doctor are **Steve Berrelleza** (Phoenix, AZ) and **Justin Williams** (Phoenix, AZ). "Steve has the outside shooting range and also can go inside. He also gives us a back
