They say an army is just as good as its leader. If that's the case, the WNMU coaching staff is in good hands. Scott Woodard enters his 10th year as Athletic Director for WNMU with high hopes. Woodard, a 1985 graduate of WNMU was an all-star shortstop at Western, and was twice named to the all conference team in the tough Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The Carlsbad, New Mexico product received his Bachelor of Science in Biology and his Master of Arts Administration.

While Woodard was a star on the baseball field as a player, his true talent may be in the dugout, as his now-eight-year-old softball team has become the tyrants of the Pacific West Conference, rolling up the last three Pac-West Championship banners. Woodard stepped aside after the 2001 season from coaching to be able to spend more time getting the athletic department back in the role of dominance it held in the early 1990s.

"We have some extremely successful programs here, and we are striving to make all the sports very competitive," says Woodard. "We all (coaches) recruit the same areas, and I can honestly say for the first time since I've been here, we have a staff that is aggressive and will bring in top quality kids and those kids will leave Silver City with a quality degree and a great athletic experience."

dr. roland shook, compliance coordinator

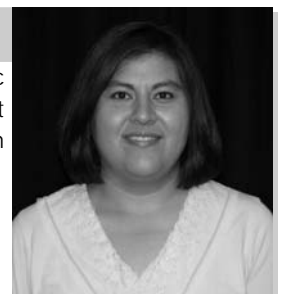

Coach Campos served as an assistant for his first two years under Brent Hansen and moved up to the top spot after Hansen took over the women's basketball team.

Having coached distance running since 1995, Coach Campos has worked with many distance runners and his charges have brought his technique to a variety of venues with great success, including professional distance runners based out of Mexico from 1995-2001.

Campos athletes have campaigned in the World Cross Country Championships in Cape Town, South Africa, World Track and Field Championship in Seville, Spain.

A Lordsburg resident, Coach Campos is a 1996 graduate of WNMU and was a member the cross country team in 1994.

After a tough first season in the RMAC, the women's and men's cross country team will move ahead to try to regain the success they had in the 2005 season as a member of the Heartland Conference.

"We had just come off a conference championship in the Heartland Conference, and in the '06 season, WNMU made the move to the RMAC, which is the strongest conference in the nation for cross country in Division II," says second-year head coach Macario Campos. "It was a huge challenge we had ahead of us. But despite that, everyone improved from the previous season." That is all a coach can really ask for.

As the 2006 season progressed, the training by all runners improved, enabling the runners to run faster at competitions, specifically when the team went to the University of California – Riverside on September 30, 2006. On the men's side, nearly every participant improved their time by two minutes from the first meet one month earlier. The women improved their times by one minute.

Despite having a few key losses on each roster, Campos is hoping a few returners will step-up and fill leadership roles. On the female side, sophomore **Chelsea Nelson** (Prewett, NM) will return after taking a year off to recover from injury.

Senior **Pam Erickson** (Golden Valley, AZ), the number two runner, will compete in her final season in a Mustang uniform. "She is coming along well, and she will be able to step up to every challenge," states Campos. Last season Erickson came in second for the Mustangs five of the six races, finishing best at Arizona State University with a time of 19:56.

The men has junior leader **Kempton Jackson** (Gallup, NM) back. Jackson was the Mustangs number one runner all season last year. He placed sixth in the Northern Arizona University invite opening weekend (26:25). "Kempton has been running well since his freshman year, so I am excited to see him compete this coming season," comments Campos. "Overall, all three of these individuals are key runners because of their consistency at the races."

Campos also has quite a few outstanding recruits on each side this season. "I feel all of these recruits are outstanding. That is one reason we recruit them," says Campos.

Freshman **Amy Roybal** (Pojoaque Valley, NM) joins the Mustangs as a three-time AAA All-District and All-State selection. She is also a four-year state track qualifier. Pojoaque Valley High School's student-body president last year, Roybal sustained a hip injury during the 2006 summer that sidelined her for the 2006 fall cross country season but had her running again during the 2007 spring track season.

"Amy is a great student athlete," says Campos. "She brings leadership and toughness to WNMU. I am excited to have her run for WNMU."

The men's side has many new runners from the northwest part of the state. **Chris Weaver**, a 5'9" Gallup Catholic High School graduate, lettered in track and field for the past four years. He also lettered in cross country and soccer in 2005 and 2006.

In 2006, Weaver finished first in the New Mexico Athletic Association (NMAA) 2A 3200-meter race. This past fall he finished seventh overall in the NMAA 1A/2A cross country race.

"Chris will be an asset to our team," states Campos. "I am excited to have him join our program. He is a great student-athlete, and he comes from a great academic and athletic program."

Ryan Nez also hails the Northwest region. Nez, a graduate of Navajo Pine High School Schools, is a two-time Class 2A state champion in cross country as well as track. Fifth-year head Navajo Pine High School coach Tim Host said Nez had been a huge part of the team's success.

"The state championships would not have happened without him," Host says. "We are going to miss his leadership. He was always the first to practice and the last to leave."

Host added that since Nez was on the team, he had helped bring out more kids, getting the program to go from 25 to 45 runners over the last three years.

Overall, both the women's and men's cross country teams are well-rounded in age and maturity, which will make for a successful season AND team.

Team. Even though cross country is considered an individual sport, Campos does not agree. "Being on this *team*, everyone on the team is a key factor. In cross country, you need five runners to score. The faster you run, the faster the team average is. That is what wins," says Campos. "So the number five runner is as important as the number one runner. And to add to that, if one runner goes down during the competition, then the number six runner becomes a scorer so everyone becomes essential."

"We will have another challenging schedule this season, but if we work as a team, we should be very successful," concludes Campos.
