Scott Woodard, Athletic Director



They say an army is just as good as its leader. If that's the case, the WNMU coaching staff is in good hands. Scott Woodard enters his 10th year as Athletic Director for WNMU with high hopes. Woodard, a 1985 graduate of WNMU was an all-star shortstop at Western, and was twice named to the all conference team in the tough Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The Carlsbad, New Mexico product received his Bachelor of Science in Biology and his Master of Arts Administration.

While Woodard was a star on the baseball field as a player, his true talent may be in the dugout, as his now-eight-year-old softball team has become the tyrants of the Pacific West Conference, rolling up the last three Pac-West Championship banners. Woodard stepped aside after the 2001 season from coaching to be able to spend more time getting the athletic department back in the role of dominance it held in the early 1990s.

"We have some extremely successful programs here, and we are striving to make all the sports very competitive," says Woodard. "We all (coaches) recruit the same areas, and I can honestly say for the first time since I've been here, we have a staff that is aggressive and will bring in top quality kids and those kids will leave Silver City with a quality degree and a great athletic experience."

Dr. Claudia Leonard, Faculty Athletic Representative



Originally from Detroit, Michigan, Claudia Leonard joined the Mustang staff in 2007 as the faculty athletic representative. An associate professor in the Occupation Therapy Assistant (OTA) program, Leonard first came to WNMU in 1997 and then took a break for two and a half years from WNMU before returning again in the fall of 2005. She

currently serves as the academic fieldwork coordinator in the OTA department.

Leonard received her Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy from Eastern Michigan University in 1983. She then went on to earn her master's degree in business from WNMU in 2001. She recently completed her Doctorate in Occupational Therapy at the University of St. Augustine.

Victoria Stimac, Assistant Athletic Director for Media Relations/Senior Woman Administrator



Victoria Stimac headed south to take the reins of the newly created Assistant Athletic Director of Media Relations in the spring of 2007. Stimac handles the duties of sports information director as well as senior woman administrator and will coordinate community and university relations for the athletic department.

Formerly at Finlandia University in Michigan, Stimac was the assistant athletic director, senior woman administrator, sports information director, and head women's volleyball coach for four years.

Originally from Cedar Grove, Wisconsin, she played volleyball at Cardinal Stritch University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where she was a three-year volleyball starter as a middle hitter and co-captain her final season and majored in business and marketing.

Stimac is actively involved in the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators (NACWAA) and the Collegiate Sports Information Directors Association (CoSida).

Roland Shook, Compliance Coordinator



Dr. Roland Shook held the Faculty Athletic Representative post since 1993 and was an integral part of the Athletic Department, as well as the university's academic department. Now in his retirement, Dr. Shook has the responsibility of being the Mustang's compliance coordinator. His responsibilities as the compliance coordinator include

scrutinizing each athlete's transcript and signing off on their eligibility status and acting as arbitrator and investigator when student athlete, coaching or other athletics related issues arise.

Kent Beatty, Assistant Athletic Director



As a new school year begins, new jobs and responsibilities within the athletic department also begin. Head golf coach Kent Beatty has been promoted to assistant athletic director. Beatty will take over full responsibility of game management, facilities, and sports medicine.

"Kent has been with us for 11 years. He knows the ins and outs of this department," says athletic director Scott Woodard. "He has had great success on the golf course with the men's and women's programs. I am confident he will have the same success in his new role of assistant athletic director."

Beatty will oversee all game day planning and management. He will also work directly with the maintenance department and athletic training staff.

Success has followed Beatty during his coaching career. Entering his 12th season as the head golf coach at WNMU, Beatty has learned many of the tricks it takes to lead a successful program, and it shows. Both his men's and women's teams are regular participants in the post season, an accomplishment which has been instrumental in giving WNMU's other athletic programs the confidence to succeed.

In addition to 21 NCAA post season tournament appearances and six conference championships in his 11 years at the school, Coach Beatty has mentored five all-Americans, seven academic all-Americans and five PGA golf professionals.

A Class A member of the PGA of America, Coach Beatty started one of New Mexico's golf dynasties at Ruidoso High School, a team that has captured five state championship trophies in recent years and continues to churn out top players that are also excellent students.

Beatty also serves on the NGCA All-American Committee and was the NMAA High School Golf Committee's chairman for seven years.

Alma Arellano, Athletic Administrative Assistant



Alma Arellano has become the glue that holds the athletic department together since her arrival as athletic secretary. She coordinates the teams' fundraising and travel accounts, while managing the student work studies. Her transfer from the Business Office has been a real asset to athletics as she is a real team player!

Meredith Drahota, Office Assistant



Entering her second year in the department but her sixth year at WNMU overall, Meredith Drahota, a four-year WNMU softball student-athlete, takes on new responsibilities for the 2008-2009 school year. Terra Strain returned to Silver City and WNMU in 2007 after seven years away. In her second year as a staff member, she assists the successful volleyball program and is full-time in the athletic training room where she works with the Western New Mexico women's programs.

Strain, a graduate of the Movement Science program at Western, wore a Mustang volleyball jersey from 1996-2000. During her four years, she was on the Gold Honor board each semester. She also was named to the Pac-West All-Conference Academic Team in 1999.

After WNMU, Strain attended Montana State University - Billings where she received her Master of Science in Athletic Training degree in 2006. She also was an assistant volleyball coach for the Yellowjackets for one year.

Most recently, Strain worked as an athletic trainer and head girl's volleyball coach at Bradshaw Mountain High School. The Virden, New Mexico native also coached for the Arizona Mile High Volleyball Club for one year and three years at Holbrook High School in Arizona. At Holbrook, she was the 3A North Co-Coach of the Year in 2002 and the 2004 1A-3A All-Star Coach in 2004.

Michael Stimac, Men's Athletic Trainer



Michael Stimac changes gears for the 2008-2009 school year. A part-time employee of the WNMU athletic training staff since March 2007 and a full-time employee of Gila Regional Medical Center in Silver City, Stimac enters the training room now full time.

Involved in athletics since the age of three and a former collegiate athlete, Stimac played hockey at Finlandia University where he received his Associate of Applied Science in Physical Therapist Assistant in 2004. He then went on to Northern Michigan University to get his Bachelor of Science in Athletic Training.

Stimac brings in previous athletic training experience from Michigan Technological University and Northern Michigan University, both NCAA Division II institutions and members of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). At Tech, he worked with nearly every sport over his six years as a student athletic trainer. While at Northern, he worked primarily with women's soccer and football.

Stimac also has a great amount of rehabilitation experience. While at Gila Regional Medical Center, he rehabilitated a variety of ages within the in-patient setting. He also fitted and adjusted adaptive equipment for patients, provided wound care, and assisted in the instruction of back safety.

Prior to moving to Silver City, Stimac worked in therapy at Portage Health in Hancock, Michigan.

Macario Campos, Head Cross Country Coach



Coach Campos returns to WNMU for his fifth overall season with cross country with a wealth of experience and a table full of impressive accomplishments, both as a runner and as a coach.

Coach Campos served as an assistant for his first two years under Brent Hansen and moved up to the

top spot after Hansen took over the women's basketball team.

Having coached distance running since 1995, Coach Campos has worked with many distance runners and his charges have brought his technique to a variety of venues with great success, including professional distance runners based out of Mexico from 1995-2001.

Campos' athletes have campaigned in the World Cross Country Championships in Cape Town, South Africa, World Track and Field Championship in Seville, Spain.

Coach Campos is a 1996 graduate of WNMU and was a member the cross country team in 1994.

Pam Erickson, Assistant Cross Country Coach



Making the transition from player to coach, Pamela Erickson will assist head cross country coach Macario Campos for the 2008 season. "Pam was a great athlete these past two years for us," says Campos. "Her energy and enthusiasm for the sport is a great asset to our program."

Erickson was one of the top woman runners the past two seasons. Her best race came during the 2007 season in the Tom Strandt Memorial Run held in Durango, Colorado. She came across the finish line seventh and in a time of 21:12.

Prior to Western New Mexico University, Erickson was an All-Arizona Community College Athletic Conference selection at Yavapai College and an all-state runner her sophomore and senior year at Kingman High School in Arizona. She also was an all-region honoree and the cross country team's MVP all four years of high school. She also received the school's track MVP award four years.

Erickson will graduate in May 2009 with a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology and a minor in Sports Medicine.

Cross Country 2008

2008 Season Preview

On the women's side, Adams State College captured the 2007 NCAA National Cross Country Championship. Western State College and Adams State finished tied for second on the men's side. Overall, six teams from the RMAC finished in the top ten at the national championships. Western New Mexico University hopes to be there in the future. And it starts with head coach Macario Campos' goal of continuous improvement in the RMAC Championships.

Last season the women finished tenth at the conference meet, staying consistent with their first year (2006) in the RMAC. The men were able to jump two spots in 2007, going from ninth to seventh. Helping make that jump for the men were WNMU's number one runner **Paul Gonzalez** (West Covina, CA) and 2006 number one runner **Kempton Jackson** (Gallup, NM).

Gonzalez came across the finish line first for the Mustangs in every race except one. His best placing game at the Kachina Classic in Las Cruces, New Mexico last September. He finished fourth of 49 runners with a time of 23:48.7, his fastest of the season. Jackson, who was injured on and off throughout the season, saw his best race at the Tom Strandt Memorial Run in Durango, Colorado on September 1, 2007. He finished the ten kilometer race with a time of 39:16, good for 17th place.

"Both of them will return with great experience and know what to expect at the high level that the RMAC has," says Campos.

The men will miss the 2007 number two runner, however. **Ryan Nez**, a graduate of Navajo Pine High School Schools, was a two-time Class 2A state champion in cross country as well as track. Nez was the first Mustang in at the RMAC Championship held in Durango. Campos hopes the newcomers will help fill this void.

Freshman **Donovan Jackson** (Gallup, NM), a graduate of Gallup High School, was All-District 1-5A his junior and senior year. He was also an Academic All-District 1-5A selection, a Chief Mohulieto Scholar recipient, and the Marines Athlete of the Year his senior year.

Coming from the land down under, **James Moloney** (Tamworth, Australia) will begin his collegiate career after playing eighth in the Australian All-Schools Meet. "Both of these student-athletes have excelled as runners and will benefit from the running environment that Silver City has to offer," says Campos.

On the women's side, Campos has his number one through five runner back including **Chelsea Nelson** (Grants, NM) and **Ellen Mork** (Tucson, AZ); however, his number one runner has used up her eligibility and will return and become his assistant coach. Pam Erickson was one of the top woman runners the past two seasons. Her best race came during the 2007 season in the Tom Strandt Memorial Run. She came across the finish line seventh and in a time of 21:12.

"Pam was a great athlete these past two years for us," says Campos. "Her energy and enthusiasm for the sport is a great asset to our program."

Cassandra Sanchez (Acoma Pueblo, NM) and **Amy Roybal** (Pojoaque Valley, NM) return for their sophomore seasons. "Their passion for the sport and mental toughness are key factors that will help them improve and excel," says Campos. Sanchez finished strong at the end of the season at the RMAC Championship. She finished the race in 25:07.24, placing 23rd and first for WNMU. In her first collegiate race, the Tom Strandt Memorial Run, Roybal placed 12th, her best of the season.

Rebecca Gazar (Flagstaff, AZ) and **Ashley Marrufo** (Demining, NM) are the lone newcomers on the women's side. Gazar will wear purple and gold for the first time after coming from a great running town. Marrufo joins the Mustangs after being a four-year all-district runner. Campos is confident they will work well with this program.

Much of WNMU's running schedule includes their traditional meets like the Kachina Classic and the University of California – Riverside Invite. Campos did add a Colorado University – Boulder meet, though, to compete against much of the RMAC prior to the RMAC Championships. "Since most of the RMAC tends to compete up north and we compete mostly in the southwest, we rarely meet in the regular season," says Campos. Campos also has organized the first WNMU home meet, the Mustang Stampede, on October 11. The race will be held at the Silver City Golf Course.

WNMU opens up their 2007 season September 6 at the University of New Mexico Lobo Invitational.
